



# Argentina Logistics Lithium Battery

How many companies are involved in a lithium project in Argentina?

These are some of the findings from a report prepared by the consulting firm Aleph Energy, led by Daniel Dreizzen, which analyzes the global lithium market while delving into Argentina in greater detail. These are the 41 companies of various characteristics that participate in the country's 64 projects.

That's still enough to have established the country as a major producer behind Australia, neighbouring Chile and China. Of the three, only one is a newcomer -- Minera Exar, which is majority owned by Ganfeng Lithium Group Co.

As mentioned above, transporting lithium-ion batteries is regulated by UN3480 (for batteries "contained in or packed with the equipment, but not attached to the source") and UN3481 ("contained in or packed with the equipment, installed/integrated at the source"). There are also IATA regulations for air transport. Shippers must follow these rules, be appropriately ...
